Summer Camp Medication Requirements

Medication Information

ALL camper medication will be collected at Welcome

Prior to camp, please communicate with parents that Young Life requires each camper to turn in most prescription medication to medical staff. Medication will be collected and held in the camp infirmary during the week of camp. Our medical staff will ensure that each camper takes their prescribed medication as scheduled. For your convenience, we have included a letter to share with parents that includes all of the following information. We encourage you to also communicate to parents that we have a full infirmary with over-the-counter medications. They do not need to bring any of those medications for any "just in case" scenarios.

Medication Collection Instructions

- Medications must be in their original prescription bottles/packaging.
- Emergency medications (EpiPens, Albuterol Inhalers) will not be collected and will remain with the camper during time at camp.
- Birth control and prescription allergy meds can also be kept with the campers.
- **On your way to camp**, collect medications in zip lock **bags clearly labeled with the camper's name and area number**.
- **At the Welcome tent**, turn in all camper medication to Head Leader team.
- Medications that are to be administered at camp must be listed on the health form. If it is a medication that has been prescribed after the health form was finished, instruct parents to edit and update their health form prior to the camp week.

Health Forms

Young Life requires that all camp participants (every person on camp) provide a completed health form upon arrival. For any non-online forms: The health form **MUST** be signed on each signature line. Due to HIPAA laws, health forms must remain at the camp. Areas should photocopy all health forms prior to arriving at camp. The area should keep a set with them in case something should occur while traveling to and from camp.

Commonly Missed Health Form Details

- Medications not to be administered at camp should not be recorded on the health form.
- Immunization information – AZ State does not require immunization records. Have parents click the button that says "Applicant will bring paper immunization record" but they **DO NOT** need to send it.
- The name of their insurance company and policy number (if they do not have insurance just check "not currently insured")
- Both parent's and camper's signature on the bottom of the form.
- Camper's weight

Please note that if any of this information is missing, your camper/leader may not be able to participate in the Obstacle Course on the first night of camp.
